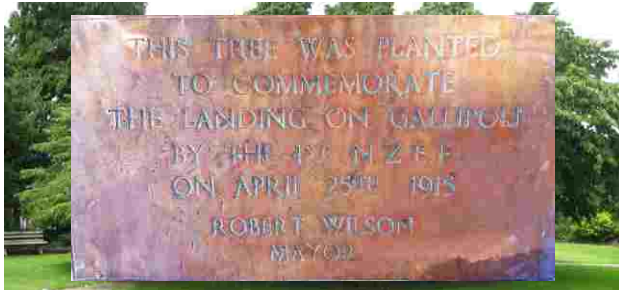


## Central Southland - A Wealth of War Memorials

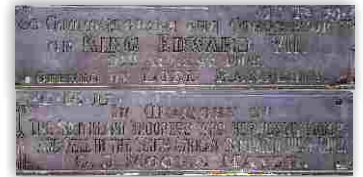


1. The landing of Gallipoli by the 1st NZEF, April 25, 1915

In 1974 I began learning the bagpipes from Winton resident, Max Wells, and over the years while playing at numerous events I became very curious about the war memorials and Rolls of Honour I saw in various halls, schools, lodges, churches and sports facilities."

Ann said she was surrounded by a wealth of untapped knowledge for example, she didn't realise her teacher Mr Stewart McKerchar, was a returned serviceman.

"In 1990, after meeting with Vince Boyle, the late Winton historian, and quering him as to the importance of these memorials. Vince's declaration "if its not recorded, it won't be history" started me on documenting in earnest."

Central Southland held their serviceman and women in the highest regard. Communities, societies and various organisations all created their "tributes of thanks" hence the area is rich in war memorials and Honour Boards.

When asked "why" she had devoted so much time and effort to this task Ann responded, "my interest was intially sparked while at high school reading "Mark of the Lion" a brilliant book on Charles Upham VC.

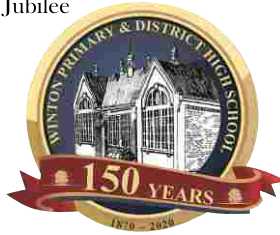

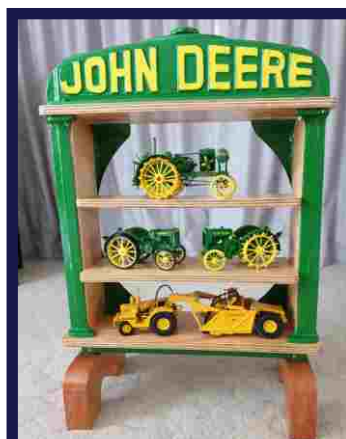

## Three waters at Southland District Council

Conversations about proposed three waters reform have been flowing at national and local government level and Council has been wading through a lot of information to better understand what the future may hold for Southland since the reform programme was announced in 2020.

As part of this process, significant work has been undertaken alongside local government partners across Otago, Southland and the wider South Island.

In 2020 Council committed to phase one of the government's proposed reform; signing a memorandum of understanding with the Crown to engage in discussions with central government about the reforms. Council provided central government with a high level of information regarding its three waters delivery, relating to age and condition of assets, compliance and consenting information, resources, funding, levels of rates and other key data.

Council received \$13.53 million in stimulus funding, allowing it to undertake a significant programme of renewals and upgrades of water networks throughout the district.

In 2021, the government announced plans to amalgamate all New Zealand councils' water services into four publicly-owned multi-regional entities. Under the proposals, Southland would be part of an entity covering most of the South Island, excluding Nelson and Marlborough. Council-owned three waters infrastructure would be merged into the new entity.

While no decisions have been made, councillors have discussed the three waters reform at length and are preparing initial feedback to seek further clarification from the government.

We appreciate there are many facets to the proposed reforms and Council will continue to keep the public updated through our website, reporting and media releases where appropriate. Further information is expected soon and, at this stage, councils will have until the end of the year to opt in or opt out of the proposed reforms.

Whilst DIA has calculated a \$350m capital investment over the next 10 years, Morrison Low has calculated a capital investment requirement of over \$150m in three waters over the next 10 years. It is important to note that in the absence of clarity around the new regulatory environment, the 2021-2031 LTP has allowed for capital investment of approximately \$100m.

NOTE: The Department of Internal Affairs (DIA) is the lead central government agency coordinating the programme of three waters reforms.

NOTE: Morrison Low are consultants which have worked closely with the Otago Southland three waters collaboration advising on the three waters reform.
