Garden Club beautifying walkway



In 2018 there was an unsightly large In Spring last year members from hedge along the walking track off the garden club and their partners had a working bee

When the property next to the walking track was sold to the new owner Grant Heatherington, he removed the hedge putting in a fence along the boundary.

Although a great improvement, the area now was very bare. The Winton Garden Club proposed a garden development to enhance the area

Early consent/permission was given by the Southland District Council to go ahead with the development.

Members from the Garden Club started the development in spring 2019 with the support from Winton ITM, Hire & go and Garnie Cowie. The first plantings were 7 varieties of flowering prunus trees, each one flowering at a different time. Compost and fertilizer was added to enrich the soil.

This was followed with a selection of shrubs planted in 2020 & 2021.

In Spring last year members from the garden club and their partners had a working bee covering the garden with wood chips kindly donated by Neville McPherson.

Thanks to Grant Heatherington for watering the trees, Neville McPherson for the wood chips and Singleton Signs for donating the sign.

The garden sign has now been erected on the fence noting that the garden is donated and maintained by the Winton Garden Club.

To the walkers, cyclists and public using the track, enjoy the beautification which has been developed for all to enjoy.

Short, sweet and tons of fun!



We had an awesome night for Mid Oreti's first native planting workshop.

24 people descended on the AB Lime office wetland and learnt, from AB Lime's Ainsley and Brad how to gather and sow native grass seeds. It was great to see lots of new faces. Key take homes were: -Carex (grasses), Harakeke (NZ Flaxes) and Toetoe are good to collect now in Southland

Drill holes in your containers for drainage (we used ice cream tubs), fill them up with potting mix about 3/4 full, pat down, scatter the seed, sprinkle a bit more potting mix and lightly pat. You should still be able to see the seeds.

Seeds are best planted fresh after they are collected, and you need to keep them moist in a semi shaded place outdoor (so they don't dry out too much).

They will germinate anywhere between a few weeks to a few months so be patient!

When these grow, the group will hold another workshop to show people how to transplant and pot up when the seedlings are 3-5cm tall, along with a tree seed collection event, and maybe even start a native plant swap.
