Wastewater upgrade planned for Winton

**MEDIA RELEASE
14 JULY 2022**

Southland District Council has appointed GHD Limited as the lead design consultant for a new Winton wastewater system.

Solutions for the final treatment and disposal method for the Winton community started with 10 options. Five of these options were discounted because they involved discharge to water.

After considering a range of criteria, for example treatment quality, odour, noise, value and key stakeholder engagement, the list was further refined. At this stage the option considered most viable is to construct a treatment facility at the existing Winton ponds and pump the treated wastewater for disposal to land near Winton.

The current project estimate is between \$27 million and \$66 million.
