



## Winton netballers awarded ANZ Netball Grant

Winton Netball Club can take their game to the next level after being awarded an ANZ Netball Grant. ANZ Netball Grants give netballers across Aotearoa an opportunity to apply for anything they need to continue playing the game they love – from uniforms and training gear to resurfaced courts and money-can't-buy experiences. After another difficult year for community netball, where COVID-19 cancelled games and shortened seasons, ANZ is helping to ease the fundraising effort for clubs and teams across the country.

Team manager Georgia Herdman applied for an ANZ Netball Grant because for the past two years, COVID cancelled the club's typical fundraising activities and they needed some help to accommodate the influx of younger players. "We've got 17 teams so we would normally replace a minimum of 35 balls a year." They were awarded new gear including training and match balls, bibs, spot markers, and carry bags to help them get their teams into training, which Georgia shared amongst the club.

Georgia was excited to receive this ANZ Netball Grant to help her give back to her community.

"It takes a huge weight off the bank balance when you get a grant like this, and it makes the team look smart when they are out training."

Georgia said that COVID has caused a lot of struggle for their little community. "It's getting tough enough on the average family to be able to pay full fees. Over the last year or two we've had to do some special discounts."

"We normally run 18 teams so we're actually down a team this season."

Georgia thinks this grant will help to secure the future of the club.

"It definitely makes people want to come back when you have good gear, it's a well-run club, you're all looking smart, and when we are helping out the players and giving back to the players"

ANZ General Manager Marketing, Matt Pickering says: "We're proud to support netball from the grassroots clubs and schools in Central Otago to the elite players in the ANZ Premiership and the Silver Ferns. Community netball has had it tough over the last two years so we hope ANZ's support makes it easier for players to continue playing the game they love. We know it's the clubs and schools across the country that help to nurture the next generation of players and we hope these grants give teams a boost and fill them with the confidence to play their best game."

## ANZ to help get Winton kids to the crease with cricket fee subsidy



With household budgets feeling the squeeze, ANZ Cricket Grants will help keep Winton's younger players in the game this season by subsidising Kiwi kids' club cricket fees. ANZ is making \$50,000 available to families who would benefit from the support, and successful applicants will receive up to \$80 towards their fees - which will be provided in the form of a voucher to redeem when registering with New Zealand Cricket. This financial help could be the difference between some kids playing cricket this summer, or not.

ANZ Bank New Zealand CEO Antonia Watson says paying fees is one of the first barriers families face when deciding if they can register their child to play.

"Sport is such an important part of a child's wellbeing, both mentally and physically," Ms Watson says.

"The increased cost of living can put families in a tough position when it comes to managing the household budget. We hope this will help ease some of that pressure and keep more kids playing cricket."

New Zealand Cricket GM of Community Cricket, Kent Stead says the initiative from ANZ is extremely helpful, and he hopes families who might have thought it not possible for their children to play this season will reconsider thanks to this new initiative. "This is a generous gesture from ANZ and their support will ensure hundreds of kids won't miss out on the benefits that team sport brings," Mr Stead says.

"After a long hard winter, getting out and enjoying cricket is just what is needed." Families who may have dismissed the idea of their kids playing this summer are invited to apply at [www.anzcricketworld.co.nz](http://www.anzcricketworld.co.nz) between 15 August - 23 September 2022. A maximum of two children per family can benefit from the subsidy.

Applications for the ANZ Coin Toss experience, which gives one lucky cricket fan the opportunity to join the captains for the pre-match toss, four tickets to the game and a photo to remember it all, open on 25 August.

ANZ has been a sponsor of New Zealand Cricket for almost 23 years, injecting more than \$1.6 million into community cricket during that time.

## Winton Library Re-opens

The newly refurbished Winton Library was declared open on Tuesday 30 August after a three-year closure.

Deputy Mayor Ebel Kremer and Mrs Eileen Boyle, wife of the late Southland historian and author Vince Boyle, cut the ribbon during a ceremony to mark the reopening of the Winton Library. The building was closed in May 2019 following the discovery of mould spores.

The library will be home to the Vincent Boyle Heritage Collection of Southland books, which were donated to the community by the family following Mr Boyle's death in 2009.
