KiwiHarvest collects good food before it goes to waste and delivers it to those in need



New Zealand's largest food rescue social venture, KiwiHarvest, reduces the negative impacts of food waste on our environment by redistributing excess food and helping to create lasting positive social change by nourishing those in need.

With 11 vehicles on the road and five branches across the country, KiwiHarvest works with food businesses including growers, producers, manufacturers, wholesalers, supermarkets, caterers and retailers. They rescue the good food that is not able to be sold – whether that is because of oversupply, damaged packaging, cancelled orders, mislabelling, or because the food is nearing its best before date or end of life, and distribute this food to over 240 recipient charitable agencies. KiwiHarvest directs surplus food to the people who really need it. KiwiHarvest addresses two major issues, food waste and food poverty:

- It is estimated that 571,000 tonnes of food waste goes to landfill each year in NZ, including both residential and commercial waste.
- It is estimated 30-50% of all food produced never reaches the human stomach and 60% of the food tossed into landfill is still edible.

• If food waste were a country, it would be the third largest emitter of GHG after China and the US.
• In October 2019 Auckland City Mission reported that about 10% of New Zealanders (about half a million people) were experiencing food insecurity.

• 1 in 5 Kiwi children are living in food-insecure households.

So every other week the KiwiHarvest van visits our Community, and drops food to either myself or Anna (Salvation Army) where we re-distribute to families or individuals we know about who might appreciate some help. We never know what we are going to receive, sometimes there is a substantial number of things, others not so much. Our recipients are usually most grateful for the little box of goodies that we are able to share with them.

KiwiHarvest Southland are currently supporting over 40 recipients like ourselves (and they have a waiting list). These 40 recipients are then able to support just under 3000 people with kai on a fairly regular basis. To date they have given out the meal equivalent of 911,658 meals or 319 080 kg of food that would otherwise have headed for the land fill.
