

## Move over Hollywood, here comes Winton Primary School

'The Great Sword of Isthgul' – a fantasy adventure feature film coming to a screen near you soon!

Instead of working on another stage show, Winton School decided to create their very own feature film this year. Principal and part time Director, Steve Wadsworth has coined it the "Primary School version of Lord of the Rings".

After auditions at the very start of the year, filming began, shooting in locations all around Southland and Fiordland. All 275 students feature in the film, with a main cast of four travelling through different lands, meeting new people and creatures, some friendly and some not so friendly!

To add that professional touch, the production team have been working with Samantha Robertson, a professional videographer, who has provided all the camera and sound gear.

The film crew also includes Mr Hippy (the school's Hard Materials Technology teacher) and five dedicated Year 8 students who have been instrumental in the production of the movie. Classes have filmed their scenes mostly on Fridays, with the main cast also shooting on weekends and in the school holidays.

Costumes were designed and made by Helen Wadsworth and props predominantly made by Mr Hippy and Hildamae Munro, the school's Soft Materials Technology teacher.

A red carpet Premiere event will be taking place at the Invercargill Christian Centre on Friday 17 November. A trailer will be released at the start of Term 4 as will ticketing information. Limehills School Principal, Kat Thompson, is asking anybody associated with the school's past to share their stories and memories, school work and artefact's with the current students. The weekend will begin with a chance for visitors to reunite and reminisce on the Friday night. There will be guest speakers representing different decades of the school's history, who will be telling tales of their time at Limehills School. Malcolm Walker will be sharing stories of his years as a classroom teacher, bus controller, boiler stoker, caretaker, dance teacher, principal and latterly a much-loved volunteer.

Margie Ruddenklau will be reminiscing about her time as a pupil in the 1970s, a parent and Home and School President in the 2000's and currently as a valued volunteer and Stacey Anderson will be talking about times she has enjoyed as both a student and innovative teacher. Kathy Turnbull, will be speaking as a mother, BoT member, Enviroschools pioneer, Home and School Representative, and Deputy Principal. We are looking forward to being entertained by the two David's, Wheeley and Kean!

On Saturday, after having their decade photos taken, visitors will be guided around the school by students, where there will be displays of research and learning. Saturday night will be a time to mix and mingle with old friends and classmates, while enjoying a meal by Country Manor followed by entertainment and dancing.

Sunday has been planned as a community celebration day, where families can bring along a picnic or purchase food from one of the food trucks onsite. The Limehills School Kapahaka group will be performing, old fashioned games will be played and the pool will be open. Limehills School's 150th Jubilee will be a chance for its community of past and current pupils, families and staff to celebrate their history and to look towards the future of this beloved rural school.
