South Sea Spray is coming to Winton

An exhibition of New Zealand's finest street artists is coming to our town. Each artist will be painting a large mural in Winton's business district during the week, where people can watch the artwork being created. With the murals strategically placed, we will create an artist trail from mural to mural.

From the 15+ murals completed there will be a 'Peoples Choice Award', in which the winning artist will receive a cash prize. Each of the prolific artists will exhibit a number of their original artwork in an installation for the public.

The exhibition will be held at the Winton Town Hall. This will be an interactive exhibition that will be open daily to the public for the duration of the week throughout the festival. There will be artist talks on site, where a number of our exhibiting artists will share their stories, journeys and tribulations about their creative process and lives. These are free to the public daily. As well as a number of student workshops and mentoring throughout the week.

Dementia Support Group to Start Up:

Following on from the Dementia Information session a couple of months ago, we are now in the final stages of setting up a support group in Winton. We were hoping to kick it off this month but due to a couple of unforeseen circumstances it will now start on the 16th November, 10.30am - 11.30am in the Day Care Room at the Winton Maternity Centre. It will run on the second Thursday of each month.

Olivia from the Alzheimers Society will run the group; anyone that is affected by this disease, whether that be a support person, extended family or friends you are most welcome to come along. The idea being that you will all gain strength from learning and chatting with others who may be experiencing similar scenarios whilst traversing this disease. This will be a safe space for people to share if they need to or just come along and have a cuppa, whilst being in the company of professionals who can offer help and support when needed. New Community Share Cupboard coming soon:

I'm very pleased to report that a project that has been in the pipeline for quite some time is also nearing fruition. A few years ago, Jeannie Peebles started a project that was close to her heart in providing the community with a food share cupboard where our community were encouraged to share excess food and vegetables with others. The original cupboard met with many positives but also some negatives.

Having had many discussions with Jeannie, we decided to try and get a new and improved cupboard built and to move it to a much more public space in an effort to improve the outcomes of its purpose. Whilst recently attending a Winton Lions meeting, I was more than delighted when they offered to make this project their own. Stearne Roofing were also involved in cladding the cupboard. It looks better than I could have imagined, both very smart and professional and is now ready to be moved to its new resting space.

Discussions that were held many months ago with SDC were re-confirmed and the cupboard will shortly be placed in its new public space between The Winton Bakery and the RSA Rooms. There will be rules around the use of the cupboard but I would like to encourage everyone in the community to make use of it as it will be there for all to use. I also encourage people to ONLY take what they need and to leave what they can. Community share cupboards are a common sight in most communities.

Let's make a combined effort to make our new share cupboard a successful one. A massive thank you to Winton Lions and Stearne Roofing for their expertise and to Jeannie for her perseverance, it is much appreciated.

Winton Community Garden:

The wonderful Community Garden volunteers have been busy in recent weeks. Seed raising has started and planting has taken place at both the Mitre 10 site and the Ravensdown site. The first lot of spuds are poking through the soil, the tunnel house is undergoing some alterations to try and alleviate some of the heat that affects the tomatoes during the summer months.

The team are planning on having a stall outside the Presbyterian Church Hall on Winton Open Day, come along and have a chat. This was a huge success last year in educating the public about what the Community Gardens are about, they will also have a colouring competition for the kids (and/or the adults) to take.

At the recent School Holiday Programme held at the Presbyterian Church, the children got the opportunity to plant a spud in a bucket courtesy of the Community Garden, some also enthusiastically planted radishes. These buckets went home with the children with instructions on how to look after them, so later in the year they can empty their buckets and reap the rewards of their hard work.

The Community Garden has also recently hosted Dylan from the Riverton Environment Centre, who ran a free seed raising workshop courtesy of our Winton Community Gardens. Although numbers were small on the day, participants were encouraged to get hands on and all went home with new knowledge and some seeds / seedlings. Keep an eye out for future workshops as we are keen to try and keep the educational workshops "growing". If there is any topic you would like to learn more about, please get in touch and we will see what we can do to accommodate any requests.

Our volunteer that works with a few school pupils also reports that she has 4 very enthusiastic girls and boys who are proving to be very good listeners. They have planted peas and radishes in one of the beds at the Mitre 10 site. More will be planted on a weekly basis going forward.

And remember if you know of anyone that would benefit from having access to the vegetables from our roadside stall during the growing season get in touch.
