DIVISION 1: Trumpet

Usually solitary flower each have a trumpet that is as long as or longer than, the petals. Late winter or early spring flowering.



DIVISION 2: Large Cupped

Solitary Flower each have a cup at least one third the length of, but shorter than, the petals. Late winter to early spring flowering.



Flowers are often borne singularly; each has a cup not more than one third the length of the petals. Spring flowering.



DIVISION 4: Double

Most have solitary large or semi-double flowers with the cup and petals, or just the cup, replaced by petaloid structures. Some have smaller flowers in clusters of 4 or more. Spring flowering.

DIVISION 5: Triandrus

Nodding flowers, with short, sometimes straight sided cups and narrow, reflexed petals, are borne 2-6 per stem. Spring flowering.



DIVISION 6: Cyclamineus

Flowers are borne usually 1 or 2 per stem with cups that are sometimes flanged and often longer than those of Div 5. Petals are narrow, pointed and reflexed. Early to mid spring flowering.

division 7: Jonquilla

Sweetly scented flowers re borne usually 2 or more per stem. Cups are short, sometimes flanged; petals are often flat, fairly broad and rounded. Winter or spring flowering:



DIVISION 8: Tazetta

Flowers are borne in clusters of either 12 or more small, fragrant flowers per stem or 3 or 4 large ones. Cups are smll and often straight sided, petals broad and mostly pointed. Late autumn to mid spring.

DIVISION 9: Poeticus

Flowers each have a small coloured cup and glistening white petals. They are borne usually 1 but sometimes 2 per stem and may be sweetly fragrant. Late spring flowering



DIVISION 10: Split Corona

Usually solitary flowers have cups that are split for a third or more of their length. Cup segments lie back on the petals ane may be ruffled. Spring flowering
