

### Milestone for Kōwhai Reach Reserve

One of Southland's special places has celebrated another milestone.

Kōwhai Reach Esplanade Reserve, at Kauana, had its new picnic and outdoor classroom area officially opened on Tuesday 26 November. Fittingly, the new Kōwhai Reach sign was unveiled by longtime resident Francis Shand with help from three young Limehills School pupils.

In the 1940s Mr Shand's father Alex, along with fellow local farmer Alex Stewart, stood up to the Southland Catchment Board, which was doing river straightening work, and refused contractors access to Kōwhai Reach. The community gathered behind the two men and the catchment board backed down. Eventually the reserve was placed under a Oueen Elizabeth II covenant in 1987.

Limehills School has been closely associated with the reserve for 25 years. Currently school pupils are making and selling rat traps with the aim of making the area predator free by 2050. Money raised goes towards making more traps.

Ōreti ward Southland district councillor Margie Ruddenklau, who has fought for the development of Kōwhai Reach for around five years, was thrilled with the reserve's latest milestone.

"I'd like this place to be a visitor destination," she said.

Cr Ruddenklau was a founding member of a working group that included QEII representatives, Limehills School, catchment groups, Hokonui Rūnanga, and Southland District Council staff, who all pitched in to help regenerate the area.

# EMERGENCY HELIPAD UPDATE

The Helipad Project Committee is pleased to announce that we have nearly secured the necessary funding to commence construction of our new helipad early next year. This development marks a significant milestone in enhancing our emergency response capabilities and improving patient care.

### **Project Overview:**

- Objective: To construct a modern helipad that facilitates rapid and safe air ambulance access, ensuring timely medical interventions for critically ill or injured patients.
- Funding: The project is primarily funded through generous community, business and trade contributions.
- Timeline: Construction is scheduled to begin, and possibly be completed, in the first quarter of next year.

### Community Impact

The new helipad will significantly reduce the time required to transport patients to specialised medical facilities, thereby improving survival rates and health outcomes. It will also enhance our capacity to respond to emergencies in remote and rural areas, providing equitable health-care access to all residents.

### Keep Christmas tradition alive: Support needed for new festive flag system

For nearly 20 years, Winton's main street has come alive with festive Christmas flags, thanks to the efforts of Winton Area Promotions (WAP).

Many years ago, WAP initiated, fundraised and purchased Christmas flags for along Great North Road, with initial fundraising supported by local businesses and families purchasing single flags. The first set of 26 flags kickstarted a tradition that has brought holiday cheer to the community every year.

Since then, WAP has purchased and replaced several sets of Christmas flags and covered costs of putting the flags up and down. Installation was completed voluntarily by local linesmen, but health and safety and traffic management requirements have put a stop to this. As such, costs have significantly increased, making it unsustainable for the group to continue in the same way.

To keep the tradition alive, Blair Irwin and WAP are exploring a new pole system which would allow the group to manage flag installations independently. It would ensure better flag longevity, reduce ongoing costs, and allow other events such as Anzac Day to be celebrated. Many towns in Southland and around NZ use this system.

While the costs involved with implementing this new system are significant, many costs are one off and the benefits long-lasting.

Winton Business Association has, along with WAP, pledged money towards the project. Unfortunately, whilst supporting the overall project aim, the Oreti Community Board has declined our application for funding in recent funding rounds.

Regardless, WAP remains determined to bring the holiday spirit back to Winton's main street and are actively seeking funding from other sources.
