Winton Community Gardens Update

The Winton Community Gardens (WCG) have almost finished our third growing season which was full of firsts for us. It was our first season where we grew our produce from seed; our first season with our new tunnel house and glass house; our first season where we didn't have to rely on community/council funding. Our financial support came from donations made by the Winton

community for vegetables obtained from our Vege Stalls at Mitre10 and the Winton Community Market.

We would like to thank the following volunteers for their amazing efforts throughout the current growing season. Mary Galt and Marius Adendorf for their magnificent seed raising efforts. Norm Cox has once again managed to produce bumper crops from the Mitre10 raised beds. Peter Wilson and Bruce Fraser have done wonders at the Ravensdown site, especially with the building up of the soil fertility and depth. Bruce project managed the establishment of the tunnel and glass houses, which have proven to be very successful in growing our warmer climate crops. Ken Galt has performed his engineering skills around the gardens, one of which was the development of large netted cloches at both the Ravensdown and Mitre10 sites; he also finds the time to mow the grass around the Ravensdown site. Joy Nicol has been brilliant at supervising the St Thomas Aquinas students as they tend their raised bed at the Mitre10 site. Most important of all is the work done by Louise Faithful who goes about her task, mostly unseen, of delivering our best produce to those in need within the Winton community. The above attributes are far from exhaustive. Those involved with the WCG perform far more than can be mentioned in such a small article as this, but we are extremely thankful for everything they do.

In late February we were honoured with a visit by students from Drummond Primary School, during which, 13 year old Elijah Sim was very impressed with the way the WCG helps the local community by giving fresh vegetables to those in need. Subsequently, he and 11 year old Quintin McKenzie, who are both participating in the school's Leadership Program, decided that they would like to support the WCG by organising and running a fundraising event to assist with the purchase of seeds. On 29 March Elijah and Quintin sold carrot sticks and humus, and freshly made popcorn at Drummond School to the other students. The amazing sum of \$59 was raised which Elijah presented to WCG volunteers at the Ravensdown Site on 9 April 2019. Thank you, Elijah and Quintin; may God bless you in all your future endeavours.



At the end of March a group from the Roxburgh Community Garden also visited the Ravensdown site in order to ascertain how we go about operating a community garden. They were amazed at how much infrastructure had been developed in such a short period of time. Our response to their observation was it would not have been possible without the support of the local businesses and contractors who provided labour and materials, either free of charge or at reduced cost.

In preparation for bedding down the garden beds for winter, we were considering using pea straw, as most Southlanders do, but were hesitant at the cost of the required number of bales. However, an anonymous member of the Winton community came to our rescue and purchased 100 bales from Trevor and Lynley Taylor who delivered and helped stack them. For that generous donation we are very grateful.

Overall, it has been a challenging, yet exciting, growing season. We are looking forward to next season where we can put into effect the lessons learnt from this one. As always, we hope to see new faces working in, or for, the gardens. It is truly a rewarding experience; just ask Elijah and Quentin.

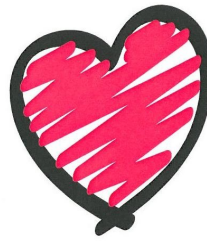

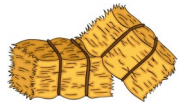

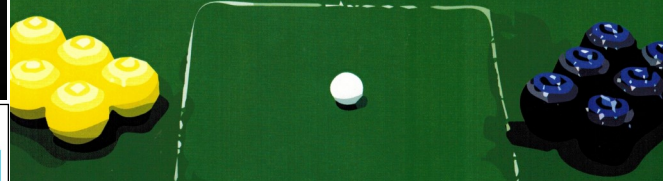
